'CREDIT CARDS' FOR CONFESSION



RENOVATIONS IN THE PARISH CENTRE

The Maher Lounge is 99% finished as is the Milne Room. Work in the kitchen has progressed at great speed and the kitchen is now fully functioning, even if some of the decorating work, tiling and flooring remains to be completed. However, none of that prevents the kitchen be fully used. Work in the backstairs to the four rooms and toilet above the kitchen area is well on the way to completion. In the very near future, we shall move into the hallway and entrance area but all the needs to be done there is decorative. A new main door has been ordered and should soon be here. This means that within a month or so - at the latest by the end of January, all internal work in the hall should be complete. I am sure you will appreciate the extensive work which has been carried out. We now have two comfortable function rooms, furnished and decorated to a high standard. It would be good to see more use made of them in the new year.

Within a few years, the roof of the parish centre will need 'looked at' - so many of the slates are loose, some of the gutters need replacing. But I have opted to address this at a later date. The greatest bulk of this work has been financed solely from, the income to the parish centre, bar profits etc.

A few people have remarked on the fact that the church needs a bit of a 'spruce up' in the way of a paint and a clean. I am aware of that. However, there are a few things that need to be tackled beforehandprincipally dealing with water ingress. You will all be aware of the paint peeling off above the 'Mane Nobiscum Domine' That is due to water getting in and so that must be dealt with before decorating. That is not the only leak we have . Hopefully this will all take place in the first few months of 2014.

I am still hoping to do all of this without asking for a 'second collection' but I am confident that should this change and I have to ask for a few special collections, Holy Family parishioners will rise to the challenge.

In the meantime, please keep in mind the tradition of giving a little extra gift at this time of the year (The 'Christmas Collection'). This will be simply the offertory at Christmas Masses. If you will be away on Christmas day, can I ask you perhaps to give something over the next few weeks. That will help to offset some of the cost of the work I hope to initiate next year.
